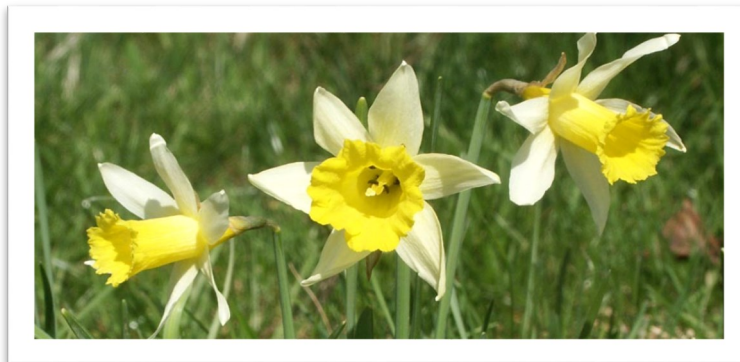


St David—Do the little things!

It's common knowledge that along with the leek and dragon, the daffodil is also a symbol of Wales. However, did you know that not all daffodils are native to Wales. In fact, the native daffodil is quite rare! Most of the daffodils that we see are invasive species and have escaped from gardens.

Why not go for a walk to try to spot a native daffodil. It thrives in damp woodlands and meadows, grows in clumps, carpeting the ground, and is a short plant with six pale yellow petals surrounding a golden yellow trumpet.
